THE FIRST CROWN

Before there was a treasury, there was a promise.

According to the Chronicle of Actarion, at the founding of the Kingdom one of its first fundamental decisions was made: the existence of Actarion would not be bound to the possession of land. The Kingdom was not to begin with territory. It was not to begin with a border. It was to begin with a symbol.

That symbol became the first coin of the Kingdom — the TARION.

The first issue of the Tarion entered the history of Actarion under the name THE FIRST CROWN and became the first official issue of the Royal Mint of Actarion.

The first coin was struck not merely as a monetary token. Its original purpose was something greater — to become the first material witness to the existence of the Kingdom of Actarion.

Documents may be lost. Archives may be destroyed. Servers may fall silent.

Generations may pass.

But metal can outlast them all.

For this reason, the TARION was conceived as an object capable of passing through time and preserving evidence that Actarion existed, possessed its own history, and left behind a material witness to its existence.

The obverse of the First Crown bears the portrait of the Founder of the Kingdom, serving as a testament to the origin of Actarion and the beginning of its dynastic history.

The reverse bears the denomination 100 TARION, surrounded by the symbols of the Sun and Moon, the Tree, the signs of Actarion, and a system of orbital lines. Together they form a symbolic map of the world of Actarion: origin, time, knowledge, continuity, and the passage of purpose beyond the span of a single human life.

Each struck coin belongs to a specific issue and is entered into the Royal Mint Register of Actarion — the official register of the Royal Mint.



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Thus, every Tarion receives its own place in the material chronicle of the Kingdom, while THE FIRST CROWN shall forever remain the opening chapter of its numismatic history.

Its holder acquires more than a coin.

The holder becomes the custodian of one of the physical witnesses of the First Era of Actarion.

And when, decades or centuries from now, one of these Tarions comes into the hands of someone who knows nothing of Actarion, it will still be able to fulfil its original purpose.

It will be able to say:

We were here.
